"When we developed our calendar of programs and special events this year, we focused on two things: Reaching more people and making it easier for people to attend. This is why you see more events in more places around Marlborough. (Check the start times, too.)

"The Veterans event at the Senior Center and the programs at the library and the lofts should be especially helpful in raising awareness of the Society and its role in historic preservation, education, and celebration here in Marlborough.
